



#### Disposal of small animal carcasses

#### Small home appliance recycling

Resources such as gold, copper, and rare metals are effectively utilized by picking up home appliances from unburnable waste brought to the Okutomi Environmental Center, and the small home appliances collection boxes. These collection boxes, with a slot of 25 cm x 10 cm, are installed in the city hall, community center, Recycle Plaza, and civic center. Four types of home appliances (televisions, air conditioners, washing machines, clothes dryers, refrigerators, etc.) and PCs cannot be accepted.

#### Recycling of the four types of home appliances (TVs, air-conditioners, washing machines/clothes dryers, and refrigerators/freezers)

- ☐ The four types of home appliances (televisions, air conditioners, washing machines/clothes dryers, and refrigerators/freezers) are not collected or accepted in the city in accordance with the Home Appliance Recycling Law.
- If you want to dispose of the home appliances above, please ask the appliance retailer where you bought them from to come and collect. A collection/transport fee and a recycling fee will be charged.
- Collection/transport fee.....This is not a standard charge. Please ask the retailer.

The fee varies depending on the manufacture and product. Please call the Home Appliance Recycling Ticket Center ( 00 0120-319640) for details. You can also consult the Home Appliance Recycling Ticket

Center website (http://www.rkc.aeha.or.jp/index.html). If you do not know from which retailer the appliance was purchased, consult with the nearest home appliance retailer or general waste management service which handles the four types of appliances (for a fee).

When bringing waste in to the collection sites below, please pay the recycling fee listed above (separate transfer fee required) at your local post office, pick up the recycle ticket and post office issued Transfer Payment Certificate (receipt), and then give it to the collection workers.
